- "Ofsted inspections report on how schools' use of the funding affects the attainment of their disadvantaged pupils. We also hold schools to account through performance tables, which include data on:
 - o the attainment of the pupils who attract the funding
 - o the progress made by these pupils
 - o the gap in attainment between disadvantaged pupils and their peers"

At Bibury C of E Primary School, we strive to ensure that all children have the opportunity to achieve their full potential.
