MIGHTY OAKS

Over the last couple of weeks in English, the Mighty Oaks have been gathering facts about single-use plastic and identifying all the places where it is evident within the school. We have used this information to write a persuasive 'pitch' encouraging our school leaders to get involved in a campaign to make Bibury a single-use plastic free school. Having signed up to 'Surfers Against Plastic', a number of pupils are keen to make a start on eliminating these plastics in the new term and we will keep you posted of their work.

In maths, year 5 have been exploring decimals and their link with fractions, while year 6 have been learning about ratio, scale factors and proportion and both year groups have been learning about percentages.

We have enjoyed some practical investigations in science recreating positive adaptations as part of our study of evolution and inheritance and the children have suggested some thoughtful links between physical features and likely survival of species. We also made a video timeline showing the development of life on earth and several pupils enjoyed adding their own 'Attenborough -style' narration as we played this through.
