- Islam is the second most popular world religion after Christianity.
- Most of the world's Muslims live in either Asia or Africa.
- There are approximately 2.7 million Muslims in England and Wales, and there are over 5700 Muslims in Gloucestershire (mostly in the city of Gloucester)

Did you know?

- The Five Pillars of Islam are the core beliefs and practices that Muslims follow.

Shahadah – There is no other God than Allah.
 Salah – Praying five times a day.
 Zakah – Giving to charity to help the poor.
 Sawm – Fasting during the month of Ramadan
 Hajj – Visiting Makkah once in your lifetime.
